Poverty poses an enormous problem for society—and is an issue of great concern to all faiths. The misery and destruction wreaked by poverty in Northern Ireland is enormous. How can we effectively tackle the multiplicity of issues involved?

This morning conference is for people from faith communities and organisations to be informed and to work on policies which will broadly represent the faith sector. It is a standalone event—anyone is very welcome to attend—but also follows up another conference on poverty in March.

The keynote speaker, on *Meeting the Challenges of Poverty*, will be Prof Mike Tomlinson of QUB, and a reflection on faith involvement with the issue will be provided by Malachy McKernan. But at this conference there will be plenty of time for discussion and participant input through small working groups on particular aspects of poverty including food banks, child poverty, rural poverty, migrants and poverty, and inequality and poverty.

The conference is organised by the Community Faiths' Forum.

It takes place at the Indian Community Centre, Clifton Street, Belfast, and runs from 10.00 am (tea, coffee and reception from 9.30 am) until 1.15 pm and finishes at this stage with lunch (Indian vegetarian). There is no charge for attending.
